Loader Training Saskatchewan - Loader Training - Anyone who wants to operate a forklift should take a Loader Training program to be able to become a certified forklift truck operator. There are various ways to obtain forklift training. Programs are offered through workforce training agencies, company forklift certification programs, and approved video and on-line courses. The cost could be minimal (or free of charge) when provided through employment agencies or by occupational safety officers on job sites.

Forklift operators should be 18 years of age or over, in nearly all countries. Local industry bodies approve Loader Training programs and require operators to obtain a certificate before using this kind of heavy equipment. A certificate is valid for four years in nearly all areas. Businesses that hire staff to drive lift truck trucks can face serious liability problems if operators fail to keep this certificate up to date.

The untrained forklift operator is more at risk to result in injuries or damages due to improper operation of the forklift. Hence, safety training courses will comprise right techniques for driving and loading. Workers must pass a written test in order to be certified. A business will usually assign a supervisor to be able to provide hands-on training to new workers. A licensed supervisor should have extensive training in lift truck safety and be licensed as a trainer.
