MSDS or also known as Material Safety Data Sheet training is also covered in the course. Even if not related directly to the operation of a lift truck, MSDS training is essential if an operator notices a leaking container or damages a container containing toxic materials. MSDS sheets list the proper methods of handling spills, the products and their effects on people.
