The individual inside the bucket often includes an upper set of controls allowing manipulation of the bucket's position. The reach of the bucket could be extended on various models by telescoping in order to adjust the lifting arm. Safety controls which are automatic prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are recommended when it is needed to clear obstacles or for working in tight spaces.

Cherry pickers, as the name implies, were originally made for picking fruit in trees at high levels. These devices are usually utilized in various industries like for instance mining, exterior painting and construction. Occasionally they are used for cleaning windows on high structures. The devices are utilized to service electrical equipment, telephone and cable television on utility poles. Fire fighters sometimes use cherry pickers, called snorkels, when ladders are inadequate. During Christmas season, civic workers could be seen in cherry pickers hanging lights and banners.
